
Elevational Zones for Special-Status Wildlife Species that are Known to Occur or May Occur within Yuba Roadside Fuel Treatment Project Area



Purpose: This example table from the Yuba Roadside Fuel Treatment Project shows how elevational zones may be used to aid in implementation of special-status wildlife measures on projects that occur across a large elevation range.
