## 1) Call to Order, Hybrid Meeting Format, Roll Call, and Core Values – Kristina Wolf

### 2) Report by the Co-Chairs – Co-chairs Drew Coe and Dr. Elizabeth Forsburg-Pardi

- a. Co-Chair Drew Coe reported on open, pending open, and expiring seats on the EMC:
  - 2 monitoring community seats and 1 agency representative seat currently open. Seeking replacements for Members Dr. Drury and Dr. Love-Anderegg seats Members Dr. O'Connor and Dr. Love-Anderegg's seats are expiring

- **b.** Currently a report is undergoing analysis: CalFire's post-fire salvage study ('relatively poor performance'); report available later in the fall.

## Board Staff Dr. Kristina Wolf reported on Grant funding:

- Timeline for grant funding has been moved up for future years with the goal of giving researchers an extra ~6 months to use the funds for their research.
- Dr. Wolf presented the Project Liaison Guide; has been sent to all EMC members and is also available online; guide for liaisons coordinating with project PIs, writing/submitting end-of-year reports, keeping communication logs.

#### 3) Project Updates

- Drew Coe:
  - EMC 2018-006 (Kevin Bladon): just had its post-doc leave for a full-time faculty position, but report should still be completed by October 2023
  - EMC 2017-006: CRAs should be given to the committee around the time of next meeting
  - EMC 2017-001: was not able to obtain additional staff for this study, so its timeline might be longer
- Matt O'Connor:
  - EMC 2018-003: this project has been completed, will be working on the CRA
- Discussion regarding support staff assisting with being project liaisons, working on CRAs (consensus that assistance from support staff is acceptable)
- Discussion regarding liaisons who are also project PIs completing CRAs (consensus that, in such instances, those liaisons should not be the lead on CRA completion).
- Dr. Kristina Wolf:
  - o 3 new projects from 2022/23 will need project liaisons
  - Follow-up email from this meeting will include these three projects and ask for volunteers to be project liaisons

#### 4) <u>Review of 2023/24 Full Project Proposals – Dr. Kristina Wolf, Board Staff</u>

- Redacted versions of the project proposals will be posted in the Meeting Materials section online.
- After discussion, EMC members will finalize their project rankings during the lunch break and submit them to Dr. Wolf.
- Review of budget: if all proposals were granted, the EMC would be ~\$7,000 short in 2023/24; partial funding of a project is possible. Budget projections can be viewed here:

• EMC members engaged in discussions for the following four project proposals:

### EMC-2023-001: Climate Adaptive Post-Fire Oak Restoration

- Forsburg-Pardi: no comments.
- Coe: no comments.
- Waitman: Concerned the study was not primarily focused in timberlands; liked study design, doesn't see relevance to forest practice rules.
- Burke: Appreciated the foundational research that could be used for restoration; sees how it could be applied to commercially managed timberlands, but is a "stretch"; not sure how he can reflect that in his rankings; Dr. Wolf comments that the rankings are not the only criteria on which projects are chosen.
- Leonard: Liked the project overall and would hope to hear more on how it could be applied to the FPR.

- Hostler: no comments.
- o O'Connor: echoes above comments.
- Nannizzi: echoes above comments.
- Jones: Sees harvesting of fuel wood in southern CA as a potential application of this study, but also a stretch.
- Meurer: Lots of variables in this project (ex. precipitation), concerned since the project open spans three years and the data set that would result; Perhaps better suited to a controlled laboratory setting than a field one.
- Short: echoes above comments.

#### EMC 2023-002: Assessing Fire Risk and Post-Fire Recovery in Riparian Areas

- Coe: intrigued by it; concerned about overreliance on remotely sensed data; would like to see more field verification.
- Forsburg-Pardi: no comment.
- o O'Connor: echoes Coe's comments; notes the low amount of requested funds.
- Waitman: thinks there are opportunities to better apply findings from this study to the FPRs.
- Meurer: useful data, would also like to see more of a ground-truthing component.
- Hostler: likes the study for its base data set, but unsure how it would apply to any possible FPR changes.
- Short: should take into account that no journal article proposed, just a publicly-released data set.
  - Dr. Wolf comments that some journals will just publish data sets, could go that route.
- Burke: surprised this proposal hasn't already done but values the proposal if it hasn't.
- Leonard: could be a good data set for the price.
- Jones: no comment.
- Nannizzi: fascinating topic in a much-needed research area (have to manage riparian zones at some point); wish the project had "connected the dots" better.

#### EMC 2023-003: Pre and Post Harvest Fuel Loads for Site Productivity

- Forsburg-Pardi: no comment.
- Coe: very relevant to the forest practice community; Would like more information on how many replicates the study will have (statistical power).
- Nannizzi: agrees very applicable for forest practice community.
- Short: had concern with lack of specificity in some sections ('duplication of plots, etc.')
- Burke: by far his favorite project.
- Waitman: no comment.
- O'Connor: echoes previous comments.
- Jones: liked the study, called it ambitious; number of plots would be extensive.
- Hostler: discussed with Drew Coe the value of photo points.

 Discussion of whether the EMC can ask for substantive changes before approving funding for a project; Dr. Wolf says there is no set procedure; requests could be presented to a project's PI and discussed from there (conditions can in theory be put on project approvals); However, Kristina suggests that this not influence the recommendations on other projects (I.e., recommendations solely contingent on available funding).

### EMC 2023-004: Oak Woodland Management

- Forsburg-Pardi: no comment.
- Coe: useful, but niche subject; was not sure about the proposed treatment into strips and whether that was the best approach.
- Meurer: echoes Coe's comments.
- Hostler: no comments.
- Short: wants to know how these findings would apply to other forest types.
- O'Connor: not that applicable to a commercial forest scenario; in response to Coe's comment, notes that a figure on the following page shows a decent distribution of species within the treatment strips.
- Waitman: shares concerns that have already been stated; not concerned with the treatment strips, however; Likes the study, but thinks it's a stretch to apply it to the FPRs.
- Nannizzi: applications are niche, but still interested in the subject matter.
- Leonard: questions about the degree to which this data can be extrapolated.
- Jones: would like to see more justification for the methods; concerned about the treatments being adjacent to each other.


- o EMC-2023-001: 15.4

- Member Coe encouraged the EMC to not spend all the money now just because they have it available; can hold out for an even better project in a future year.
- Lengthy discussion on EMC-2023-002 regarding how close the proposed deliverables would be to a usable/useful product; generally consensus was that the final data set would be quite a bit more work.
- Lengthy discussion on EMC-2023-004 regarding the broader implications on woodrat-specific data.
