<i>Promote appropriate grazing for fuels management and multiple ecosystem services</i>	a. Develop standard template/form(s) with a guidance document for constructing grazing license agreements for use by state agencies.
	b. Develop or approve informational publications which agencies can use for conducting site inventories and assessments, developing adaptive management plans detailing the general use and specific objectives for the management unit, and producing detailed grazing plans that will form the basis for grazing licenses.
	c. Coordinate with state agencies and major public landowners to facilitate an inventory of existing land management plans to assess which elements required for the grazing plan are already available.
